Math

This week in math we will work on establishing our math classroom rituals and routines. We will begin our year working in Module 1 Topic A. The students will learn how to use place value understanding to relate to adjacent base ten units from millions to thousandths. The students will also use exponents to name place value units and explain patterns in the placement of the decimal point.

During our math rotation block, I will be introducing the 8 Mathematical Practices. The 8 mathematical practices include: make sense of problems and persevere in solving them, reason abstractly and quantitatively, construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others, model with mathematics, use appropriate tools strategically, attend to precision, look for and make use of structure, and look for and express regularity in repeated reasoning.

We will also begin our beginning of the year i-Ready diagnostic testing the last week of August. I am looking forward to working with all your children this year in math. We will have a very fun and exciting 5th grade year!
